Identity Theft



D = Buying or making an illegal copy of someone else's work, most likely films and CDs.

E = Anne brought a DVD from her local shop, once home, she realised that it had been filmed from a cinema seat. She went to the police and was told that it was illegal and that the seller would be fined and she would need to get rid of the copy.

A = Article 16 - Privacy -

The law should protect the child's private, family and home life, including protecting children from unlawful attacks that harm their reputation.

D = Using someone else's name and personal information to use for personal gain, often loans or credit; financial or fraud.

E = Sam wants to borrow money from the bank but they won't let him. He steals his neighbour, Jack's, information and pretends to be him to get the loan.

A = Article 8 - Preservation of identity

Governments must respect and protect a child's identity from being stolen or exchanged.
